So I suggest that you change your line on your reels and put on some fresh 4 lb. test line. Check your tackle box and restock it with fresh gear. Remember our club sells power bait at a really good deal. With fresh line and with your tackle box all restocked, we can start doing some fishing at Lake Wohlford on Thursdays. On the fourth Thursday, we will try another lake. That location will be mentioned at our general meeting on the third Friday of the month.
