SURF FISHING SCHEDULE

Wednesday - July 21, 2010 - 3PM - Power Plant shoreline and jetties - Between life guard towers 30 and 31.

Suggested baits: surf - blood worms, sand crabs Gulp shrimp -- jetties squid, anchovies.

Directions: I-5 to Palomar Airport Road. Take Coast Highway north to the Encinas Power Plant and look for towers 30, 31 and jetties.

<u>Friday - August 6, 2010 - 3PM</u> - Torrey Pines State Beach - Between life guard towers 4, 5 and 6.

Suggested baits blood worms, sand crabs, mussel and Gulp baits.

Directions: I5 to Carmel Valley Road Exit. Right on Carmel Valley Road towards Coast Highway. You may get lucky and find a parking spot along Coast Highway, but I suggest parking in the large parking lot (access along Carmel Valley Road). Park in the north portion of the parking lot and use the pedestrian walk way under the highway.

<u>Thursday - August 19, 2010 - 3PM</u> - Mission Bay Park - Location to be announced. Bring a picnic Lunch or BBQ. Suggested bait razor clams we'll harvest there.
