June Speaker: **Gregory Gould**Lakes and Open Space Supervisor
Dixon Lake Ranger Station, Escondido

Greg is a Ranger in the Lakes Division for the City of Escondido. He will discuss current and future plans for management of the Dixon Lake boating, recreation, picnicking and camping areas and will also present a summary of recently completed projects. He will review Dixon Lake's plans for holding trout derbies and cat-fish and night fishing schedules. He will review current and future fish stocking proposals. The City of Escondido has multiple sources of raw water. Local water originates from the watershed and well fields and is transferred to Lake Wohlford and finally stored in Dixon Lake. Water treatment and distribution plans will be reviewed. Finally, the management and improvement agenda for Daley Ranch trails, preserve and Ranch House facilities will be presented.

Directions to Lagoon:

Take Tamarack towards residential housing from the 101 Highway. Make a right on Garfield Street. Follow Garfield to the end and park anywhere on the Street. You will see the Trail Head "Agua Hedionda Lagoon Garfield Trail Head." It is a good trail and easy access down to the Lagoon. Head around to the left once you get to the Lagoon. For reference, it's very near the White Bass Hatchery.


