Wilford (Will) G. Cozzens 01/16/1934 – 08/04/2024




This month, we lost Will Cozzens, a longtime member and a very active Senior Angler of Escondido. He was a friend, my buddy, and a darn good fisherman. He was the Vice President of Salt Water for many years, went on most RV fishing trips, helped with picnics, youth events, city fishing derbies, and fishing challenges, and was the first to volunteer when we had something special

happening. He also helped in the design and pres-Board that we presented

Will and Bev Cozzens were always in the middle of our projects. When we cooked our turkeys for the Fall Feast, Cozz had his fryer at the event. Most years, he purchased the turkeys, prepared them for the event, and ensured we had enough volunteers to cook them. And for the picnics, he made fried potato chips. WOW, they were a treat! Maybe not the healthiest snack, but they were so delicious!

Cozz retired as an engineer in the Air Force, and his background and talent were made available to us. He could make anything. He poured lead for fishing weights, made and repaired fishing rods and reels, and fixed our RVs when needed. He knew so much about everything; he even bought a Greyhound bus, yes, an old bus, and converted it into an RV. The inside of this bus was incredible, with customized white oak cabinetry, stainless sinks in the kitchen, oak wine racks, captain chairs, and plush carpeting. Bev and Cozz used this bus for years but eventually bought a smaller Class "C" and continued joining the RV group on their fishing trips.

When he was the VP of Salt Water, he set up a schedule with the landings at the beginning of the year, so we always had boats available during the season when the bites were hot. Year after year, he chartered a ³/₄ day boat out of Seaforth Landing called the "Sea Watch" twice a month; from spring through the fall, it was available for our club. Remember! We sold tickets to 25 fishermen/women, costing \$28 apiece. Our meetings had a lineup: first come, first serve. He arranged overnight and 1½ day trips during the tuna season and several trips each winter for bottom fishing. In the off-season, we also used the "Legend." The manager of Seaforth Landing knew the Senior Anglers and Cozz very well, and we did a lot of saltwater fishing. Will Cozzens just loved to go fishing!



We will miss this guy; he was one of a kind. His laugh, the smile, and the devilish look, you knew something was about to happen, and it wasn't always welcome? Like the time he said, "Hold out your hand" and put a newborn rat in it, or your bowl of ice cream had a spoon full of habanero jelly on it. Or his pomegranate margaritas that would put you to sleep early! He was a character, and we loved him. Those of you who have camped or fished with Cozz know he was a very special person.

Thanks for the memories, Will Cozzens; you will be missed! RIP


